Joutseno Art Summer International Film Festival is a new event held for the first time in summer 2023 in Lappeenranta, Finland. The main venue of the film festival is <u>Cultural Space Nuija-</u> <u>mies</u>, located in the centre of Lappeenranta. All the screenings and related events are held at Nuijamies.

To highlight the importance of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, Joutseno College is arranging this international film festival offering the pleasant atmosphere and the great natural scenery of Lake Saimaa, Finland.

We invited filmmakers from around the world to join us and submit movies that focus on the role of sustainable development and responsible filmmaking. However, submission was open to movies of other themes as well. A delightfully large number of films were submitted for the competition, and the quality of the films was very good. International jury rated all submitted movies, and based on these reviews we have selected the films that are part of offical selection. Some of these films are nominated as award winners and will duly be awarded. The awards will be given in the opening ceremony on June 29, 2023.

Joutseno Art Summer International Film Festival is open to everyone, and we warmly welcome people to see and enjoy various films. We also want to offer to children a movie experience by having a free children's screening on Saturday July 1, 2023.



Country: Denmark Directed by: Maja Ejrnæs, Nicolai Vesthammer Genre: Alternative Art Screening Time: 16:25–16:40



Orangutans might be star attractions here, but at what cost to the animal?

Country: Norway Directed by: Sanni Marjaana Naukkarinen Genre: Documentary Screening Time: 16:10–16:45



In summer 2022, a few months after Russia declared war on Ukraine, Western visitors come to gaze out at Russia and sense the reactivated tension. But who actually feels the tension, and is it really there?



Vaietut Juuret (Silenced Roots)

Vaietut Juuret – Silenced Roots – is a journey to own family history and roots. It is my story, but very similar to many other inhabitants of Lapland. Because of the last few centuries' assimilations, forest Sámi people's ancestors did not talk about their Sámi roots. Knowledge about the origins disappeared from the next generations. However, through genealogy, many have now discovered their roots. This documentary film talks about one Sámi group, forest Sámi, their status, and their lives.



Northern Performance

An EV journey to Nordkapp gets off to a dramatic start when the heating system fails. The film follows Juuso and Julia's Arctic journey to the northernmost point of Europe to find out if an electric car can survive the winter in the polar night. The approaching thirty-degree below freezing temperatures bring additional tension to the expedition struggling with charging challenges. Through their personal experiences, the film explores common perceptions of electric cars.

Bratislava is an exemplary post-socialist city. Its massive construction replaces the old with the new. The changing features of the city speak to us not only through the silhouettes of new buildings but also through its inhabitants. Blanka fights with loneliness on the balcony of her Petržalka apartment. The city is dotted with billboards as municipal elections await. Matúš wants to become a municipal councillor. Real estate agent Michal shows his clients images of a happy life through Bratislava apartments and two road workers paint traffic markings that guide passers-by. After work, they drink beer in their boarding house and muse about life. A timid Danko observes the city, which is changing too fast for his taste. He listens to it and wishes to capture the rhythm of normalcy, the flow of the days. Where does public space cease and where does intimacy begin? This is what every day sociology comprises.

Joutseno College

Joutseno College (Joutsenon Opisto in Finnish) is a traditional but forward-looking public college which was founded in 1950 in the area of the Pöyhiänniemi farm. The college's cosy campus is in an area close to nature, right by the Lake Saimaa.


Joutseno College arranges diverse education on long study lines and enhances the learning of adults of all ages. The college cooperates with various parties locally and internationally.
